On 23 June 2016, the British people will go to the polls to decide whether or not the United Kingdom will remain in the European Union. Will it be an earthquake? In any case, it is a difficult choice with consequences for both parties. Will this mean a weakened Union in the eyes of the world? The beginnings of its "dismemberment"? Of its dissolution? Or will it spell a recomposition and a new beginning? For its part, will the UK be triumphantly freed from its supposed "chains", or will it be an isolated state, reduced more-or-less to England after the divorce of the resolutely European Scotland?
