This policy hub will present and discuss the issue of the year-end backlog of unpaid claims affecting the EU budget since 2011. The problem combines both technical aspects of budgetary management and political considerations, raising fundamental questions about the architecture of the EU's public finances, including the system of own resources and the flexibility of the MFF. The EPRS has recently published an <u>in-depth</u> analysis on this topic.
